Analysis and report of community consultation questionnaire for a New Community Facility – July 2016

The New Community Facilities Working Group (NCF) held a community consultation event on Saturday 25 June 10.00-16.00 in the community centre. This was attended by 50 parishioners representing 38 properties within the parish and by 2 visitors from a neighbouring parish.

As part of the consultation a questionnaire was delivered by members of the NCF to every household in the parish. People were asked to return the completed questionnaire by 1 July to Marden village shop, the community centre, by email or post to the Clerk or to a member of the group. 107 questionnaires with addresses on were received by 1 July. Members of the group then visited houses that had not returned a questionnaire and encouraged the residents to do so as soon as possible. In total, 186 address identifiable responses were received by 16 July, the final cut-off date. A further 10 questionnaires were received that did not have an address though the respondents identified whether they lived in the village or the wider parish.

Answers from a total of 196 questionnaires have been input into a database and analysis has been undertaken on the resulting data. There are 598 properties on the postcode address list, with 22 being identified as unoccupied or holiday lets currently. Unoccupied or holiday let properties have been removed from the calculations for the responses, as answers cannot be expected from these houses.

With 196 returns, the response rate is 34%.

The analysis of responses to questions are given below. <u>PERCENTAGES ARE THE PERCENTAGE RESPONSE FOR THE 196 RETURNED QUESTIONNAIRES, UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE.</u> Percentages may not add up to 100% as some respondents did not complete every question.

Do you agree with the idea of a <u>new</u> Community Centre being built, for the community by the community – available daytime and evenings, 7 days a week?

159 (81.1%) agreed with the idea of a new Community Centre (110 living within the village, 49 in the wider parish)

9 (4.5%) disagreed (5 living within the village, 4 in the wider parish)

24 (12.2%) didn't know if they agreed (12 living in the village and 12 live in the wider parish)

8 respondents made comments to this question:

- 3 supported a new centre because of likely new houses and provided costs are suitable
- 1 queried what would happen to the current centre
- 1 asked what was wrong with the current one
- 2 pre-school to go and the current centre to be updated
- 1 wanted costed option to relocate pre-school

53 (27%) ticked *Insufficient access to health and fitness activities* (27 with adults aged 18-64, 31 with adults aged 65-80+, some households in both age groups)

57 (29%) ticked *No opportunities for training and improving skills* (30 with adults aged 18-64, 35 with adults aged 65-80+, some households in both age groups)

72 (36.7%) ticked *Insufficient activities for young people* (46 with adults aged 18-64, 33 with adults aged 65-80+, some households in both age groups)

57 respondents ticked other and made comments, of which:

29 commented on lack of availability due to pre-school use during the day or having to share the site with the school

4 identified the need for an informal meeting area/café

3 identified would be good for pre-school to have better space

3 said there wasn't an issue

Summary

GENERAL

- 1. Very good response even without the cajoling.
- 2. A very fair split of villagers to those in the wider parish, ensures good representation.
- 3. Very high percentage in favour of a new facility, both from the village and wider parish and believe it is important for the community.
- 4. Not surprisingly, those in the wider parish use the current facilities less.
- 5. It would appear that we do not provide a wide enough range of activities.
- 6. A significant number of people with mobility issues that we should try and address.
- 7. 61 children were identified in this sample aged 0-17 and we cater for none of them.
- 8. Again, no surprise, a greater number would use the centre in the evening and weekend than during the day. Note ... current usage suggests little requirement for weekend and daytime but maybe we do not offer the appropriate activities.

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Top requirement would appear to be activities for young people although, looking at activities that scored over 140 when combining essential with desirable, others included activities for the elderly, providing a venue for private functions, pilates & fitness classes, meeting rooms and outreach hub.
- 2. As you would expect, current activities available scored averagely throughout but the top two were Gardeners and Over 60's.
- 3. Sporting activities that require a hall with height not seen to be essential.
- 4. Almost all listed activities scored well as "desirable', equally the same activities scored almost as highly with "not necessary / would not use".

This all enhances the need to provide suitable rooms to enable most of these activities. It also suggests that remaining with the current hall that uses the associated height should not be an issue.
